Apostrophes for Possession



What are apostrophes for possession?



The apostrophe for possession is used to show that something belongs to a thing, person, object or place. We add 's (apostrophe and the letter s) at the end of the word to show possession. For example: This pencil belongs to Sarah. It is Sarah's pencil.

Change the sentences below to use the apostrophe for possession. The first one has been done for you.

The pencil belongs to Jenny. It is Jenny's pencil.

The book belongs to Linda.

The cage belongs to the tiger.

The phone belongs to Michael.

I ate a piece of the cake that belongs to Jordan.
